




### History of Road Revenue in Oregon

1860: Oregon's first road fee, set at 1 Day's Labor per year or \$2

1913: "Oregon State Highway Commission & Department" created

1919: Nation's first gas tax created in Oregon, set at \$0.01 per gallon

**1933**: Created first weight-mile tax for heavy vehicles, in nation.

1942: Constitutional amendment creating State Highway Fund (SHF)

1967: Gas tax reaches \$0.07 per gallon


1979: Constitutional amendment restricting SHF uses to roads and highways

1993: Gas tax reaches \$0.24 per gallon


2011: Gas tax raised to \$0.30 per gallon, title and registration fees \$82 per year

#### SHF Distribution









# Federal Highway Trust Fund & STP Funding





## USFS Timber Payments to County Road Funds



# Future of Transportation Funding in Oregon

- Increasing fuel efficiency of the vehicle fleet has undercut gas tax revenues, so what do we do?
- Road Usage Charge (RUC) Program
  - 2007: First pilot program
  - 2012: Second pilot program
  - July 2015: Volunteer 5,000 person program
- Based on Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) tax policy
  - \$0.015 per mile
